Anjung Suite

Resting above the river waters looking out into the South China Sea, the 176 square metre Anjung Suite is furnished with comfortable sofas in a spacious living and dining hall with its own bar and powder room. The bedroom provides a king-sized bed, a large writing desk, a sunken bath, two vanity units and a separate water closet. This is the premier suite within the Resort and is a one-of-a-kind location for a most memorable experience.



Anjung Room

Situated along the beachfront are 10 single-storey beach rooms, each 88 square metres in size. Every room is furnished with a king-sized bed, as well as a day bed. A symmetrical outdoor bath sits in its own private alcove and an indoor bathroom features two vanity units with a large indoor shower. The doors and windows open out to a canopied verandah overlooking the beautifully landscaped tropical gardens and sea, an ideal location for a romantic honeymoon.



Serambi Sea View Room

Each of the 23 units feature a spacious en-suite indoor bathroom with two vanity units, separate bath and shower facilities. Located on the ground floor as well as on the first floor, Serambi Sea View Rooms enjoy panoramic views of the South China Sea and verdant tropical gardens from a verandah.



Bumbung Sea View Room

These 7 rooms are located above the Serambi Sea View Rooms and are similar in size and furnishings, excluding the verandah. Instead, its windows look out to breathtaking vistas of the tropical gardens and the South China Sea.

Restaurants



Di Atas Sungei

'Di Atas Sungei' is Malay for 'Above The River' so guests will find it easy to spot this restaurant which literally sits above a river that flows into the South China Sea. With no menu, guests are guided by the Resort's Menu Masters, experts in local cuisine, who provide a distinctive dining experience using only the freshest produce of the highest quality. Surrounded by lush tropical greenery, and shaded by a huge Ketapang tree, the restaurant opens for breakfast and dinner, and serves authentic Malaysian cuisine.



Nelayan

'Nelayan', meaning 'Fisherman' in the Malay language, was inspired by the locally and internationally acclaimed signature restaurant, Fisherman's Cove. Nelayan offers a variety of Asian and Western selections for lunch while dinner features a unique symphony of seafood themed dishes crafted by Chef Wai, the pioneer of Fisherman's Cove, which focuses on sustainable fishing practices and the freshest ingredients. Its seaside setting and romantic ambience sets the perfect tone for a relaxed dining experience.



Teratai Terrace

Situated beside the Resort's free-form pool with a view of the South China Sea, Teratai Terrace serves grilled items and rice dishes for lunch, cocktails in the evenings and offers private dining experiences. Enjoy dinner, drinks and movie screenings under a canopy of stars to the sweet strains of live Gamelan music.

Snorkelling or Diving in Tenggol Island

Pulau Tenggol is a small island in the South China Sea off Tanjong Jara Resort, perfect for snorkeling and diving. The island forms part of the Terengganu Marine Park and is still a well-kept secret amongst the diving community. This means the reef is in almost perfect condition and, for people in the know, it is considered the best diving in Peninsular Malaysia. Pulau Tenggol and its surrounding dive sites offer unforgettable underwater experiences for beginners and exciting adventures for experienced divers.. Expert guides, dive master and our PADI dive instructor who are all accustomed to the currents, waters and tides around the island, accompany each trip.



Jara Walk with the Resort Naturalist

The resident naturalist escorts guests on a mild and pleasant trek through the jungle perimeter of the resort. Discover many aspects of the local foliage including some of their traditional uses that are still practiced in the surrounding villages for their unique medicinal qualities.

Cooking Class with Chef Ann

Chemerung Waterfall Excursion with Picnic Lunch

An exhilarating hike to the base of the gigantic 200 meter Chemerung Waterfall. A breathtaking view awaits at the end of this bracing trek as crystal waters cascade down the craggy mountainside to pool in clear basins of rock below.

Eco-adventure Marang River Cruise

Discover the beauty of the Marang River on this half-day cruise. A variety of vibrant wildlife, monkeys, iguanas, river crabs, sea eagles and exotic birds can usually be spotted amongst the vegetation on the river banks and in the mangroves.

A seven-kilometer cruise up the river takes guests to a jetty where they disembark and take a walk through a traditional Malay village. The villagers still practice ancient methods of food preparation and handicraft and this is the perfect opportunity to witness traditions that have almost been forgotten.

This excursion will not be available from 1 November and will re-commence on 1 March of every year.

Guided Bicycle Tour

Experience the daily lives of those who live on the shores of the East Coast of Malaysia with a guided tour through a local fishing village. Guests are able to have a taste of authentic Malay life by riding along the paths that weave through Dungun's fishing village, meeting the locals, drinking Kopi Kampong, sampling local snacks and genuinely discovering the area that surrounds Tanjong Jara, accompanied by a very knowledgeable and truly fascinating guide.

Batik Painting

Batik has come to be used as a generic term which refers to the process of dyeing fabric by making use of an age-old technique; covering areas of cloth with a dye-resistant substance to prevent them absorbing colors. With a technique thought to be over a thousand years old, thin wax lines are made with a Tjanting needle, a wooden handled tool with a tiny metal cup with a tiny spout, out of which the wax seeps. Here in Tanjong Jara, guests are welcome to learn the art of batik painting, a refined art from the east that has gained popularity in the western world over the past decade.

Golf

The Resort is able to make arrangements for guests to play at Tasik Puteri Golf Course in Bukit Besi, an 18 hole par 72 full buggy course with undulating hills and elevated approaches. This golf course is well known for its surroundings of lush greenery, scenic valleys and serene lakes.

Traditional Handicraft Tour

As the legacy of the past defines the present, the Resort offers a glimpse of rural village life in Malaysia. Witness how the heritage continues to be a source of inspiration as local artisans create traditional arts and crafts. This tour includes batik and songket weavers, mengkuang and bamboo weavers as well as a visit to a brass foundry, the Pulau Duyung Shipyard and the central market of Kuala Terengganu.
